Background:

The Miami-Dade State Attorney Office (SAO), The Miami-Dade Commission on Ethics & Public Trust (COE) and the Florida Elections Commission (FEC) received complaints/allegations that the Mayor of North Miami Beach (NMB) Myron Rosner (Rosner), at commencement of this investigation, in his bid for re-election, was engaged in activities that could be construed as violations of both Florida State statues and the Miami-Dade County Conflict of Interest Ordinance.

Chief among the complainants was NMB blogger Stephanie Kienzle.

The alleged violations mostly emanated from Rosner's re-election campaign activities.

Investigation:

The COE, at the inception of this investigation reviewed the Campaign Treasurer's Reports (CTR) of Mayor Rosner, noting an in-kind contribution from Martin Outdoor Media (MOM).

It is to be noted that Rosner was his own designated Campaign Treasurer.

MOM it was determined held a NMB revenue generating contract for "bus bench" advertisements throughout the city.

MOM also held similar contracts with various Miami-Dade and Broward municipalities.

Conversations were held, initially with then Chief Assistant State Attorney Joseph Centorino, and Assistant State Attorney Breeyze Telfair.

An investigative decision was made to subpoena various MOM principles and management personnel as witness to their knowledge and involvement in the Rosner campaign bus bench ads.

Additionally, the investigation would focus on another bus bench contract, personal in nature, where-in Rosner had MOM place, mostly in the North Miami Beach area, a likeness of himself captioned with the greeting "Happy Holidays".

This personal Happy Holidays campaign was to end immediately prior to the placement of the Rosner re-election campaign ads.

To that end Scott Martin, principle and namesake of MOM, via a telephone conversation with Investigator Kennedy Rosario, agreed to supply the investigation with both their Rosner contract and a copy of any instrument, in this case the Rosner campaign check, issued / uttered by Rosner to pay/satisfy the contract agreement between both parties. This conversation occurred on or about April 13, 2011and would later have an investigative significance.

As the sworn statements, via the executed witness subpoenas, were taken it became apparent that the investigation should include the Miami-Dade Police Department's Public Corruption Investigations Bureau.

Detective Luis Rodriguez joined the investigation as Lead for MDPD PCIB. PCIB also took the lead agency role with the COE's collaboration.

ASA Breezye Telfair became the investigation's prosecutor.

Also enlisted was Maggie Amaya, MDPD PCIB Financial Analyst.

Due to the involvement of MDPD PCIB as lead agency all material information and documents were turned over to Detective Rodriguez.

All information and documents, i.e.: subpoenas and their respective compliance document (s), sworn statement transcripts, etc., accumulated after the entry of PCIB were and are held by the SAO and Detective Rodriguez, although many of the items noted above were copied and made a part of the COE case file.

CONCLUSION:

In police jargon this investigation was **CBA**, closed by arrest.

On September 20, 2012 ex-North Miami Beach Mayor Myron Joel Rosner surrendered at the JMH Ward D and was placed under arrest by MDPD PCIB Detective Luis Rodriguez pursuant to an Arrest Warrant.
