Nonetheless, I have personal witnessed the Mayor George Vajello, Councilman Anthony Defillipo, Councilwoman Barbara Kramer, and the City Clerk Pam Latimore use his or her official authority or influence for the purposes of interfering the election to get some, if not all, of the 10 Charter question passed with a "YES" vote. Please see the Miami Herald article titled "North Miami Beach voters face slew of ballot measures" dated October 18, 2016, and also please review the Minutes, Agenda, and Video

of the North Miami Beach city meeting dated November 1, 2016. Its clear that these city officials have violated several state statutes including: F.S. 104.31(a), F.S. 104.061(a), and F.S. 104.091. I humbly request that this commission to please investigate.


