LAW ENFORCEMENT MANAGEMENT: US Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) is the primary security, counter-intelligence, counter-terrorism, and law enforcement agency of the US Department of the Navy (DON). NCIS special agents are armed federal law enforcement investigators, who frequently coordinate with other US government agencies. NCIS special agents are supported by analysts and other experts skilled in disciplines such as forensics, surveillance, surveillance countermeasures, computer investigations, physical security, and polygraph examinations. NCIS is an Echelon II command within DON and fulfills the criminal investigative, counterintelligence, combating terrorism, and physical security responsibilities for the Secretariat, the US Navy, and the US Marine Corps.

DUTIES: Lieutenant Steven D. McCarver, United States Navy, distinguished himself by exceptionally meritorious service as Senior Military Counter Explosive Advisor and Team Chief, General Counter Explosive Directorate Advisory Team, Iraqi Police National Headquarters Transition Team, Iraq Training and Advisory Mission-Police (ITAM-P), United States Forces-Iraq, Baghdad, Iraq, from 4 March 2011 to 1 December 2011 during OPERATION NEW DAWN. Serving in a Colonel's position, Lieutenant McCarver led a team of four civilian police advisors responsible for guiding training and equipping over 4,000 Iraqi Police Counter Explosive Team members. He was responsible for assisting the Iraqi General Counter Explosive Directorate (GCED) in implementing policies and procedures for the national counter explosives program. Because of his superior advising skills, he was able to secure complete access to Major General Abdullah, Director, GCED. Despite the great differences in rank, the two officers have developed a great working relationship and worked jointly to improve counter explosives mitigation and investigations improving the IP's ability to respond to attacks in Iraq. He orchestrated the delivery of explosives ordnance disposal equipment to GCED and its subordinate provincial teams--for the first time in		

Iraq's history, its provinces are properly equipped to render safe all types of explosives. He was personally responsible for coordinating the training of over 200 Iraqi Police Counter Explosive team members to International Mine Action Standards for Counter Explosive and Counter IED Technicians. Lieutenant McCarver's advisory team worked directly with U.S. and Iraqi Police partners in all 18 Iraqi provinces developing a comprehensive strategy aimed at reducing the IED threat within Iraq. Lieutenant McCarver understood the need for GCED to conduct provincial assessments so each director could balance resources where they were needed the most. He worked closely with MG Abdullah and his staff to develop a provincial-wide assessment plan identifying the strengths and weaknesses of his directorate. MG Abdullah has unequivocally adopted Lieutenant McCarver's plan. Looking across ITAM Police, Lieutenant McCarver recognized the need to improve the capabilities of the Federal Police explosive ordnance disposal units. Lieutenant McCarver's team has developed a thorough and well thought out plan to develop a Federal Police Mobile Counter Explosive Unit capacity development plan for training and equipping. Lieutenant McCarver's excellent relations with GCED and his in-depth understanding of Iraqi counter explosives capabilities, allowed him to work closely with the U.S. Counter Explosives Exploitation Cell (CEXC) lab to provide and process evidence effecting U.S. force protection operations. His efforts with the CEXC lab ensured Iraqi access to evidence collected from nearly all explosive events in the Baghdad area. Additionally, he was instrumental in the short-notice relocation of the CEXC lab from Victory Base to JSS Shield. He ensured all operational and logistical requirements were met to allow the Shield CEXC lab time to process evidence in just one week after its move to JSS Shield. His impacts in support of USF-I force protection operations during the critical re-posture phase of OPERATION NEW DAWN was significant. Due to his efforts, evidence processing of attacks against U.S. forces will continue to be exploited to prevent future attacks. The distinctive accomplishments of Lieutenant McCarver reflect great credit upon himself, United States Forces-Iraq, the United States Navy, and the Department of Defense.
